Emergency Preparedness is Standard Procedure

Last week Village Manager McDonnell, Town officials and I attended a training with the NYS Division of Homeland Security & Emergency Services. Ossining has a very proactive approach to emergency preparedness. Key staff meet regularly to review and learn from past events, and to prepare for potential future incidents. This most recent training served largely to reinforce

our current practices and connect us with NYS resources that we may draw on during a large scale event.

The experience of walking every block of the Village over the past 13 months has presented countless picturesque moments like the one captured above. Every season and every neighborhood is capable of inspiring us to pause and appreciate the beauty of our community.
