At Wednesday's legislative session, we will be voting on Local Law #1-2018 and calling for a public hearing on Local Law #2-2018. Local Law #1 is a proposed zoning text amendment that will expand the conditional use of properties in the T-Zones. Local Law #2 extends the Cold War Veteran's Tax Exemption which will expire if action is not taken.
