New Fire Apparatus & Innovative Housing Solutions

Last week we welcomed the arrival of our newest fire apparatus. Engine 101 is housed and operated by Independent Hose Company #6, located on Campwoods Road. On behalf of all of us who depend on the Ossining Fire Department to keep us safe, thanks to the team of volunteers and staff who worked together to research, design and take delivery on this beautiful new engine.

At both of the January work sessions, we discussed how best to approach updating the Village's Affordable Housing Policy. As we continue to work out the details, the Board is united in our intention to establish a policy that is founded on the proposed recommendation of the Housing Needs Assessment. Creating a policy that is consistent with the character and needs of the Village, while enhancing our economic development strategy, demands innovative thinking. This proactive approach to addressing the longstanding challenge of affordable housing, will be the most progressive policy in the county.
