Thank you to Best of Westchester winner Atria-on-Hudson for the invitation to compete in last week's Chef Showdown. I always welcome the opportunity to connect in fun ways with community members. At <u>last week's Legislative Session</u> the Village Board voted unanimously to approve a new gender neutral signage policy for single user bathrooms in Village facilities. This is a simple policy that makes a strong statement of inclusivity to transgender and gender neutral members of our community. We also passed resolutions in support of three Consolidated Funding Applications (CFAs) that will be submitted this week. We are applying for CFAs to supplement investment into private properties on the Croton Avenue corridor; rehabilitate and preserve the Village-owned 200 Main Street aka The Bank Building; and install a green roof onto our new water treatment facility.
