This Week's Village Board Meeting

This week's meeting opens with a presentation by Village Manager Debbie McDonnell about what is included in her <u>proposed 2019 budget</u>. Bring your questions and comments to the Public Hearing immediately following her presentation at 7:30pm on November 14 at Village Hall.

The Work Session that follows will include a discussion of the legal and budgetary process for enacting SCRIE (Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption) & DRIE (Disability Rent Increase Exemption). These programs are extensions of ETPA, the NYS rent stabilization program recently approved by the majority of the Village Board and currently being implemented.


The public budget meetings begin Tuesday evening, and then continue with a full day of meetings on Thursday. Click here for the budget meeting schedule, including the intended times for each departmental meeting. During this process the Village Board will review each department with its respective department head. The Village Manager has spent months meeting with staff to create her proposal. The Ossining Village Board is more hands-on than many elected boards. The final budget will be a reflection of the Village Board's priorities for the coming year. We have maintained a 0% tax rate increase for the past two years. Whether or not we are able to continue that trend depends on a number of factors. I encourage you to attend or tune in on November 14, and let us know what you believe the Village Board should prioritize in the 2019 budget.

As always, Work Sessions are an opportunity for the Village Board to have discussions with staff and invited experts regarding potential policy or legislative changes. We invite community members to reach out to us by email (bot@villageofossining.org) anytime, or to speak during Visitor Recognition at Legislative Sessions typically held on the first and third Wednesdays of the month.
