Thanksgiving Eve Off

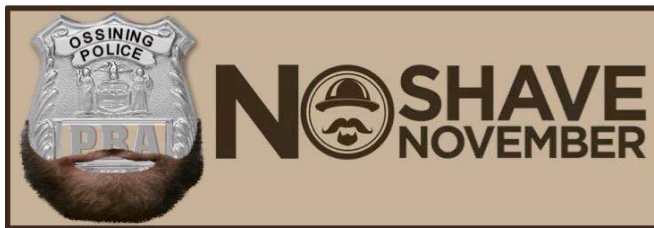
There won't be a Board meeting on Thanksgiving Eve. But we'll be taking advantage of a fifth
