Paving Progress

Everyone loves a freshly paved road! This week we will complete paving Waller Avenue, Croton Street, and the Waller Street Parking lot. Add those to Linden Avenue, Glen Street, Snowden Avenue, Croton Avenue, and Sherman Place for the 2107 list of paving projects. This picture is from the milling of Waller Avenue last Thursday afternoon. Paving in this location is happening right now.

Each paving project the Village Department of Public Works has undertaken this year includes fixing curbs and drainage, and milling the road prior paving. There are a number of funding sources that pay for paving, including CHIPS grant money from NYS, the Village General Fund, and the Water Fund (when work is following water main projects). Utility work by ConEd makes our paving schedule a bit tricky, as we saw with a year-long delay on Snowden Avenue, and the ongoing delay of Campwoods Road. When appropriate, the repaving costs are paid by ConEd, as was the case with the Croton Avenue project.
