Marihuana Regulation and Taxation Act (MRTA)

Laws and Regulations: Adult Use, Medical Cannabis, and Cannabinoid Hemp Programs

On March 31 2021, the recreational sale of cannabis was signed into law by the Governor of New York as part of the MRTA (Marihuana Regulation and Taxation Act).

The MTRA is intended to:

- Create a regulated and taxed cannabis industry in New York; and
- Provide for social & economic justice related to the sale and use of cannabis.

The NYS Cannabis Control Board & the Office of Cannabis Management will administer the state's adult use and medical use programs, promulgate rules, issue licenses, and investigate/ enforce infractions.





TIME, PLACE, MANNER


The extent to which local governments are able to restrict the activity of State-licensed establishments is limited to TIME, PLACE, AND MANNER, which can be controlled through zoning and the land use approval process.

HOWEVER:

- Notwithstanding any local regulations, retail dispensary signage is prohibited, except as authorized by the Cannabis Control Board.
- Retail dispensaries may not be located within 500 feet of school grounds* or within 200 feet of a house of worship.

Zoning Considerations



TIME, PLACE, MANNER

The extent to which local governments are able to restrict the activity of State-licensed establishments is limited to TIME, PLACE, AND MANNER, which can be controlled through zoning and the land use approval process.
