Memorial Day Ceremonies

Ossining veterans and first responders led us in Memorial Day programs honoring the fallen soldiers who did not return from battle.

Thank you to American Legion Post Commander Frank Faiella for bringing the Town and Village the suggestion of a special way to identify streets named for veterans who never came home with an American flag. Just in time for Memorial Day, flags were placed on dozens of street signs. There are seven streets in the Village (and many more in the Town) named in honor of local veterans who didn't return from battle, dating back as far as the Civil War.

On Sunday the Ossining Fire Department held their annual Memorial Day services and breakfast at Maryknoll. The program continued with moving visits to OFD memorials at three of our local cemeteries. Pictured above are the OFD chiefs

and color guard at St. Augustine's Cemetery.

The glorious weather continued for today's parade culminating with a ceremony at Nelson Park led by Michael G. O'Connor and local veterans. The Ossining High School marching band performed a number of patriotic songs. Several community organizations and local officials participated by laying wreaths that had been crafted by Ossining Girl Scouts. Boys scouts supported veterans by providing a new generation of color guard attendents. OFD, OPD and OVAC were all well represented at this morning's ceremony.

Work Session


