Community Investment

This morning Supervisor Levenberg and I joined municipal and county leaders in thanking Congresswoman Lowey for her leadership of the House Appropriations Committee that has increased funds for local investment. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding was frozen for the Village of Ossining, along with most Westchester municipalities during the

long battle between Westchester County government and the US Department of Housing and Urban Development. With the lawsuit settled, and leaders in County government that value partnerships with communities like Ossining, we are now looking forward to renewed investment from the federal government in local infrastructure projects. As County Executive Latimer stated today, "The people expect every level of government to work together to benefit the communities we represent". Let's hope the US Senate is able to work with House leadership to make these funds a reality for communities like ours.

At last week's Village Board work session we again discussed basketball court improvements. This year we are resurfacing all three of the basketball courts in Village parks (Veterans, Snowden & Nelson Parks). We are expanding the capital project to also include repair of lighting at the Nelson Parks basketball courts. After years of lights that have not worked, basketball fans throughout the Ossining can look forward to playing basketball later into the evening. This will be especially appreciated in the fall when the sun sets early. In fact, Superintendent Garrison is already thinking about plans for a basketball tournament under the lights in the early fall.
