# Mixed-Use Development & Village Square at Market Square/Post Office Lots

- A public plaza or Village Green that will allow for community events and house the Village's farmers market would be incorporated into the site.
- DRI funding would assist in the development and construction of this public space.
- DRI funding would also help with the creation of a tiered parking structure to offset lost surface parking and enable greater mixed use opportunities.



# 30 Water Street Mixed-Use, Mixed-Income Development



- The Village will use DRI funds to expand public outdoor amenities and points of interest at the development and enhance flexible, multi-purpose community space for advanced technology resources



# Renovations to 200 Main Street

- The Village proposes converting the 200 Main Street building into a privately-owned eatery and entertainment venue.
- DRI funding would be used for interior renovations of the building, which would be built out based on demonstrated market interest.
- Expanded renovations would enhance the Village's ability to sell the property to a private owner and reactivate the space after decades of neglect.



# Sing Sing Prison Museum



- DRI funding would help with capital costs associated with the phased opening of the the Sing Sing Prison Museum, which would become a tourist destination, creating jobs and drawing visitors and leaders in social justice.
- Multimedia exhibits and hands-on experiences would take visitors from the prison's early days as the "House of Fear" through to today's progressive institution.



# Improvements to Joseph G. Caputo Community Center



- The Village proposes transforming the Community Center into a state-of-the-art facility for intergenerational recreation and learning.
- DRI funding would help provide expanded and improved space for STEM and sports for children, adults, and seniors.
- DRI funding would be used for the renovation of several spaces throughout the Community Center.
