

Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative Village of Ossining, New York



#### **Project Overview**

- New York Executive Order 203 provided the impetus for organizing a thorough review of policing.
- The process was collaborative, involving a Working Committee comprised of local residents which met several times to discuss the process and the development of suggested recommendations.
- Subcommittees were created to increase the focus on specific reform areas.
- Extensive input was received through:
  - Stakeholder interviews
  - Six community meetings
  - An online survey
- In these public meetings the Village Board will receive input on the results of this process and will provide its Police Reform plan to the State.

## Suggested Recommendations Governance and Oversight

- Remove OPD representation on the CPCRB, for a total of five civilian seats, with one alternate.
- Consider hiring an outside investigator to review complaint cases.
- Change the Village Charter and the Westchester County Police
  Act to create a new police board of commissioners that provides
  more general oversight of police policies and operations.
- The OPD should make regular reports to the Police Commission on a variety of metrics.



### Suggested Recommendations Policies

- In order to increase transparency and to better inform the public, police department policies should be posted online.
- The department should adopt bias-free policing policies.
- To reduce the perception of cooperation, the department should modify its general orders so that OPD officers will not respond with ICE unless they are called to the location.



### Suggested Recommendations Internal Operations

- Work with Westchester County, neighboring communities and non-profit agencies to develop a mental health, homeless and substance abuse crisis response unit.
- Provide officers with crisis intervention training to improve response.
- Create a voluntary response registry which would assist emergency communications and responders.
- Implement new or improved existing community policing efforts including police officer liaisons with community groups, improved and more meaningful presence in Ossining schools.
- Develop a public awareness campaign in both English and Spanish to explain the OPD's role with respect to ICE activities.
- Develop an officer mental health program that includes counseling with a tele-therapy option, and an early intervention program.



# **Suggested Recommendations Hiring and Training**

- Increase diversity in department hiring and promotional processes.
- Work with Ossining High School to start a program to introduce high school students to the Ossining Police Department.
- The Police Department should develop a multi-year training plan that includes greater emphasis on:
  - Anti-racism in policing
  - Implicit bias
  - De-escalation
  - Procedural justice
  - Cultural competency
  - Handling protests
  - Crisis intervention training



#### **Next Steps**

- The project team will review the suggested recommendations in the Police Reinvention Collaborative reform report in public sessions – this one being the first of three.
