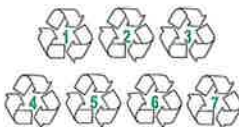

# A Handy Guide to What Goes Where

## What To Recycle

## What **NOT** To Recycle

**PLASTICS** Numbers 1 through 7 -- you'll find the numbers on the bottoms of the containers. Labels need not be removed. **Rinsed clean, lids taken off, and placed loosely in either a 30-gallon container with a red recycling sticker or an open container that is clearly marked "Recycling."**



**NO** Foam or film plastics, **PLASTIC BAGS**, vinyl, containers used for hazardous waste, or petroleum-based products.

**PAPER** Including newspapers, glossy inserts, phone books, magazines, junk mail, brown paper bags, tissue and cereal boxes should be placed loosely in recycling bins or brown paper bags.



**NO** Books (paper and hardcover).  
**NO** Carbon or NCR paper.  
**NO** waxed cardboard (i.e. milk cartons).  
**NO** Plastic and styrofoam materials.

**CARDBOARD** Corrugated, non-waxed, flattened, with all liners, styrofoam packing, plastic and paper removed, and stacked in a cardboard box or tied up.

**GLASS** Clean food bottles and jars, liquor and wine bottles, medicine containers, soda and beer bottles. Rinsed clean, lids taken off, and placed loosely in either a 30-gallon container with a red recycling sticker or an open rigid container that is clearly marked "Recycling."



**NO** Windows, mirrors, drinking glasses, light bulbs, non-food or non-beverage containers.

**METALS** Tin, aluminum, or other metals used for food and beverage containers -- including aluminum foil and empty aerosol cans. Rinsed clean, lids taken off, and placed loosely in either a 30-gallon container with a red recycling sticker or an open rigid container that is clearly marked "Recycling."



**NO** Aluminum siding, paint cans, scrap metal wire, pipes, tubing, motors, sheet metal, dirty aluminum foil, or automobile parts.

**LEAVES** *In addition to year-round collection of bagged organics, as described below, the Village will also vacuum leaves curbside during the autumn season, beginning on or about November 1.*

### **YARD WASTE COLLECTION WILL BE PICKED UP ON MONDAYS AND TUESDAYS.**

- *If your scheduled Bulk Pickup is Monday, your yard waste will be picked up on Tuesday.*
- *If your scheduled Bulk Pickup is Tuesday, your yard waste will be picked up on Monday.*

All leaves and yard waste materials may be placed at the curb in the following manner:

- **A 30-GALLON BIODEGRADABLE PAPER BAG**  
Brown lawn and leaf bags may be purchased at the John-Paul Rodrigues Ossining Operations Center for 50¢ per bag, or you can purchase the bags at any home improvement store, supermarket, etc. OR
- **OPEN TRASH BINS CLEARLY MARKED "ORGANIC WASTE"**
- **BRANCHES OR BRUSH MUST BE BUNDLED AND SECURELY TIED WITH TWINE.**  
**BUNDLES MAY NOT EXCEED 4 FEET IN LENGTH OR 50 POUNDS IN WEIGHT**

## **UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS:**

**We WILL NOT pick up the following items:**

Construction and demolition material of any kind (concrete, asphalt, dirt, sand, gravel, bricks, masonry, roof shingles, sheetrock, framing, timber, flooring, etc.); hazardous household/garden chemicals and products; petroleum-based chemicals and products (except paint); waste automotive fluids; tires; automotive parts including batteries; propane tanks; liquid waste of any kind; tree trunks or stumps; 55-gallon chemical drums; all hazardous wastes; any waste generated from commercial or industrial processes.

## **MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS**

Mattresses and box springs put to the curb for pick-up must be fully encased in a sealed plastic bag. Bags are sold at the DPW and at the Recreation Department.

**CONTRACTORS** and "Do-It-Yourselfers" are required to remove all construction and demolition debris from any work site or residence within the Village.

**IF NECESSARY**, call a carting company and get a dumpster. If a dumpster must be stored on the street, you must first obtain a Permit from the Public Works Office.

## Let's Keep Our Village Clean!

- ▶ All materials to be picked up by DPW should be accessible by 6:00 AM on collection day. Material may be placed at curbside no earlier than 5:00 PM the night before the scheduled pickup day. Remove empty garbage containers from the street the same day.
- ▶ Garbage containers may not exceed 35 Gallons in size. Containers must be plastic or metal, must be watertight and be equipped with a tight-fitting lid.
- ▶ **DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER**, your pickup may be delayed. Just leave your refuse at the curbside, the Sanitation Department will reschedule its pickup as soon as weather permits.
- ▶ Recycle bins can be purchased at the DPW at 101 Route 9A for a \$8.00 fee. Biodegradable paper bags can be purchased at the DPW at 101 Route 9A for a fee of fifty cents (50%).
- ▶ Do not leave refrigerators and air conditioners at the curb or visible from the street until the evening before your next scheduled pickup. Make sure proper freon removal stickers are affixed. **REMOVE DOORS BEFORE PUTTING CURBSIDE!** Keep your sidewalks clear of refuse and debris at all times.
- ▶ Keep our streams and river clean by keeping waste, chemicals, sediments, and bacteria from entering our storm sewers:
  - Minimize use of pesticides and lawn chemicals.
  - Do not over salt and salt before it snows.
  - Make sure you dispose of your trash properly and use alternatives to hazardous household chemicals.
  - Plant more trees and shrubs and avoid removal of existing plants and vegetation whenever possible.
  - Clean up after pet waste.

The Village of Ossining aggressively enforces these and other ordinances designed to promote the health, safety and "quality of life" of our residents. Violations may well result in the issuance of Court appearance tickets and substantial fines.

**• Vehicle Batteries**

Take to vehicle battery retailers. State Law requires they accept, free of charge, up to two (2) vehicle batteries per person per month.

**• Refrigerators Air Conditioners Dehumidifiers**

You must purchase freon disposal stickers from the Public Works Office, located at the old Armory on Route 9A, or from the Parks and Recreation Department, located at 95 Broadway, before putting your refrigerator, air conditioner, or dehumidifier to the curb for Bulk Metal pickup. The cost is \$10 for an air conditioner or dehumidifier, and \$20 for a refrigerator. **Note: Take door off of refrigerator before putting curbside!**

**• Propane Tanks**

The local company listed below accepts empty propane tanks for a nominal fee. Before transporting any propane tank, empty it through normal use, tighten the valve and seal it with a plastic safety cap. Most hardware stores and propane distributors sell replacement caps. Stand upright and do not transport propane tanks in the trunk of your car. Briarcliff Manor Fuels, 126 N. State Road, Briarcliff Manor, NY (914) 941-2660.

**• Motor Oil/Antifreeze**

Take motor oil to a service station or retail outlet. State Law requires that they accept, free of charge, up to five (5) gallons per day per person. Do not put these products in your garbage or empty them into a storm sewer. **Remember: our storm sewers empty directly into the Hudson River.**



**• Car Tires**

Try to have retailer accept them when having new tires installed. The following local vendor has voluntarily agreed to accept tires from residents for a nominal handling fee: Mavis Discount Tire, Route 9, 170 North Highland Avenue, Ossining (914) 762-1070. Additionally, the Town of Ossining will have its annual **Tire Disposal Day** on Saturday, October 20, 2018, from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. For more information about this program, call the Town Highway Department at (914) 941-2241.

**• Household Material Recovery Days**

Westchester County operates the Household Material Recovery Facility (H-MRF) on the Grasslands Campus in Valhalla. The H-MRF accepts many of the same wastes collected at the Household Recycling Days, including household chemicals, electronics, Freon-containing appliances, scrap tires, BBQ tanks, and confidential documents for shredding. Reserve a time slot for appointments up to two weeks in advance. Appointments can be made for Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays (excluding Federal holidays) from 10 a.m. to 2:50 p.m. by calling the Recycling Helpline at (914) 813-5425. **• Mattresses & Box Springs**

Mattresses and box springs put to the curb for pick-up must be fully encased in a sealed plastic bag. Sold at the DPW and Recreation Dept. for \$2 each.

**Miscellaneous**

**• Paint (latex and oil-based)**

Air dry and harden, lids off, put out for Bulk Trash pickup. Use kitty litter or speed dry to speed up hardening of paint.

**• Medical Needles**

Put in hard plastic container with screw top. Label and dispose of with regular trash, or bring to a hospital or nursing home.

**• Storm Windows**

Tape up glass and put out for Bulk Trash pickup.

**• Batteries**

Non-rechargeable and rechargeable alkaline types only. Put out with household trash.

**• Shovel your sidewalk within 6 hours after the snow stops.**

Village law states that sidewalks must be cleared of snow and/or ice within six (6) hours after precipitation has stopped or a summons can be issued. The hours between 7:00 PM and 7:00 AM do not count toward the six hours. If the ice is too thick to be removed without harming the pavement, salt or sand must be placed on the ice. The ice must be removed as soon as weather permits, in order to allow for safe passage.

**• DO NOT shovel snow into the road.**

New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law states that it is illegal to shovel or plow snow into the roadway. The Village Police Department will be strictly enforcing this regulation.

**• Alternate side of the street parking regulations must be obeyed.**

In the event of a snow storm, alternate side of the street parking rules must be adhered to. Over a period of two days, the Village must have access to both sides of a street in order to clear the entire street of snow.

**• Westchester County Mobile Shredder**

Shredding personal documents serves a double purpose — to recycle paper as well as protect sensitive information against identity theft — the fastest growing crime in the nation. Some examples of what to shred are junk mail, old utility bills, driver licenses, expired credit cards and receipts, old tax returns or any other documents containing your name, address and other identifying information and pre-approved credit card applications.

The Mobile Shredder will be visiting our community at the Community Center, 95 Broadway, on April 14, 2018 and October 20, 2018, from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. Check the Village's website for updates.

The Mobile Shredder is also present at all Westchester County Household Material Recovery Days.
























**• Please clear nearby fire hydrants.**

If you have a fire hydrant in front of or near your home, please make an effort to clear any snow and ice from around the hydrant. The Fire Department needs a two (2) foot clearance around the hydrant to hook up their water supply. The effort could be a joint project between several neighbors. In the event of a fire, the time spent by firemen clearing snow or ice from a hydrant could make a difference in the amount of damage done by the fire.

### Commingled Recyclables

Plastics (numbers 1 through 7, found on the bottom of the container); gable top cartons (milk and juice). Clean food bottles and jars; liquor and wine bottles; medicine containers; soda and beer bottles. Metals: tin, aluminum, or other metals used for food and beverage containers, including aluminum foil and empty aerosol cans. All must be rinsed clean, lids taken off, placed loosely in a 30-gallon container with a red recycling sticker or an open rigid container that is clearly marked "RECYCLING."



### Newspaper / Cardboard (Please Bundle)

Newspapers; glossy inserts; phone books; magazines; junk mail; brown paper bags; tissue and cereal boxes. Non-waxed flattened cardboard stacked in a cardboard box or tied up. Remove all liners, styrofoam packing and plastic.



### Organic Yard Waste

Place leaves and yard waste materials at the curb in a 30-gallon biodegradable paper bag, or in open trash bin clearly marked "Organic Waste." Branches or brush must be bundled and securely tied with twine. Bundles may not exceed 4 feet in length or 50 lbs. in weight.



### Metal Pickup: TVs, Computer Monitors and Appliances

Refrigerators, air conditioners and dehumidifiers may ONLY be put out the evening before pickup. Affix proper freon removal sticker. Remove doors before putting curbside!

### This Month's Tip!

Christmas trees will be picked up on Organic Yard Waste days during the entire month of January.
